2. PBARCARE01: the receiving institution will send its decision within two (2) weeks.
E SALAMAN01: the receiving institution will send its decision within four (4) weeks.

3. PBARCARE01/ E SALAMAN01: A Transcript of records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than five (5) weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.

4. Termination of the agreement

The agreement will become operative on the date of signature of both universities. In case of the termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be sent to the partner university. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

F. Information

1. Grading systems of the institutions

In the national grading system the results are awarded in a scale from 0 to 20, and the minimum mark required for approval is 10.

Each subject is graded on a scale from 0 to 10 points.

Each numeric grade corresponds to a quality grade as follows:

0-4,9: fail (D-E-F-U)

5-6,9: pass (C)

7-8,9: good (B)

9-10: excellent (A)

10 Matrícula de honor: with distinction (A*)


